## The quality and standards of the early years provision

### The provision meets requirements

- Staff have a sound knowledge and understanding of their roles and responsibilities with regard to the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The manager and staff have a good understanding of the child protection procedures approved by the Local Safeguarding Children Board. They fully understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of children.
- The manager and staff show a good understanding of how to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, risk assessments of the areas to be used are carried out and ensure the premises are secure. Staff also check the safety of resources and equipment on a regular basis.
- Staff have a sound understanding of how to promote children's well-being. There are appropriate strategies in place to teach children the difference between right and wrong and the rules and boundaries of the provision.
- Children's understanding of a healthy lifestyle will be promoted through the provision of healthy snacks and the daily opportunities on offer for fresh air and exercise.

## Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

- The inspector and manager discussed the care and welfare of children.
- The inspector observed the areas used by children.
- The inspector looked at a range of policies and documents, including the safeguarding policy and registration documents.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of staff.

## Full report

### Information about the setting

Ecclesall Kids Club (Junior) was registered in 1995 and is run by a committee. It is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary part of the Childcare Register. The club operates from the dining room and school hall of Ecclesall Church of England Junior School in Sheffield. There are currently 164 children on roll and of these 32 are in the early years age range. There were no early years children present during the inspection. Children have access to a secure, enclosed outdoor play area. The club is open Monday to Friday, from 7.45am to 8.35am and from 3.15pm to 5.45pm, in term time only. It also operates from 8.30am to 5.45pm in school holidays on the site of it's sister setting, Ecclesall Kids Club (Infant). There are six members of staff who work directly with the children. The manager holds a degree level qualification, two members of staff hold an early years qualification at level 3 and two hold an early years qualification at level 2. Two staff are unqualified. The club has access to further trained and qualified staff as required. The club receives support from the local authority.

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## Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
